### **SafeHaven hires new CFO, promotes two from within**

Fort Worth, TX (July 24, 2009) – SafeHaven of Tarrant County recently hired Don Campion as its new CFO and promoted Jeremy Carroll to Vice President of Operations and Stephanie Storey to Chief Programs Officer.

Campion came to SafeHaven from the Albert Galvan Health Clinic where he was the Chief Financial Officer and Chief Operating Officer. Before that he served as the director of finance at United Community Centers, Inc.

Carroll, previously SafeHaven's facilities manager, began working at SafeHaven in 2003. He also held the position of maintenance supervisor. As Vice President of Operations, he is responsible for overseeing all facility maintenance and improvement, including the two emergency shelters we operate, our two counseling centers, our administrative offices and our resale shop, Berry Good Buys.

As Chief Programs Officer, Storey oversees all program development and implementation including residential, clinical, transitional, legal and prevention. Stephanie began her career with The Women's Shelter in 1992 as Children's Coordinator and worked there 10 years with her last position being Sr. Residential and Transitional Services Director. She then worked as the Asst. Executive Director for the Arlington Life Shelter for five years. After a brief time with Presbyterian Night Shelter, she returned to the domestic violence arena in 2007 as SafeHaven's Director of Residential Services.

### **About SafeHaven**

SafeHaven of Tarrant County is a nonprofit organization that exists to end family violence through safety, support, prevention and social change. SafeHaven's two emergency shelters, one in Arlington and one in Fort Worth, accommodate a combined 174 women and children, making SHTC one of the largest shelters in Texas.

In 2008, SHTC sheltered over 2,700 adult and child victims and provided non-residential services through our Resource Centers to more than 3,700 other clients seeking emotional, legal and practical support to move from "victim" to "survivor". *Staff and volunteers answered 41,767 hotline calls in 2008, an 81% increase over 2007.* In addition to protecting victims and creating opportunities to achieve independence and self-sufficiency, SHTC also educates approximately 60,000 individuals annually. The majority of these are students who learn warning signs of relationship abuse

A leader in the domestic violence field, SHTC operates a full continuum of specialized programs, utilizes community volunteers and runs a successful resale store, Berry Good Buys.
